

Robert Heim (12 years)


TERRA LINDA HS



MARINWOOD WATERDEVILS







Paige Lyons (10 years)



Marco d'Amore (12 years)



Dylan Glave (11 years)



Chris Harvey (11 years)



SLEEPY HOLLOW SEA LIONS


Keenan Dubois, 18, started swimming with the Sealions at age 5. Now a sophomore at Oberlin College, Keenan continues to keep the dream alive.

Meghan Wentzel, 18, team record holder in 15-18 breaststroke, will be playing Volleyball at Bucknell University next fall.


STRAWBERRY SEALS

Kerry Norris



Nick Patino



Julia Digiovanni




TERRA LINDA ORCAS


Alex heads down south this fall to attend the University of California at Santa Barbara. The Orcas will miss his inspiration and witty sense of humor, and wish him the best of luck!

Drew Dilsworth




know that the values he has learned in swimming will serve him well in his academic pursuits. We are so proud of him!

Hannah Gable



Colette Kolenda (11 years)


